

Exeter Phoenix 19-25 Devon Film Fund GUIDELINES

Exeter Phoenix have partnered with BFI Film Academy South West to offer one Devon based filmmaker aged between 19 and 25 access to £1000 in cash funding to support the production of a short film which is up to 12 minutes in length. The fund includes access to mentoring, training and equipment.

Applicants will be required to pitch their ideas at Two Short Nights Film Festival, 3-4 Feb 2022.

These guidelines relate to the Exeter Phoenix 19-25 Devon Film Fund 2022. Please read them carefully before submitting your application.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Exeter Phoenix and BFI Film Academy South West recognises that moving image plays an important role in reflecting our culture, establishing individual voices and can help filmmakers and artists develop new skills and long-term relationships with cast, crew and cinema audiences, both locally and nationally.

The commissions support the production of short films from all genres of film, live action or animation, fiction and non-fiction. Our aims for this fund are to;

- Support new and emerging talent within Devon
- Connect filmmakers and creative individuals to a wider cultural network in the region
- Offer a platform and opportunities for work to be shared and seen
- Recognise new, fresh and inspiring ideas from a range of perspectives.

ABOUT THE FUND

Exeter Phoenix and BFI Film Academy South West will award **one** Devon based filmmaker, aged between 19 and 25, a fund of £1000 in cash to support the production of a short film which is up to 12 minutes in length.

ABOUT THE PITCH

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to pitch their ideas to a panel of experts and an audience as part of Exeter Phoenix's [Two Short Nights Film Festival](#) (3-4 February 2022).

There will be up to 4 applicants pitching at Two Short Nights and each pitch will last up to 5 minutes followed by a further 5 minutes of questions from the panel. Pre-recorded pitches can be used or you can pitch live.

You will be asked questions about your ideas. You will also be asked to provide a brief budget and examples of how your film will be planned and produced. Exeter Phoenix will make the core questions available to all applicants who are invited to the pitch. Claire, Jonas and Luke, the team at Exeter Phoenix and Two Short Nights will be available to discuss what to expect from the pitch and to offer guidance on applying, generating budgets and extra materials. WHAT CAN YOU APPLY FOR?

You can apply for support with any genre of short film, which can be produced as live action or animation.

There is no restriction on how the award is spent but you will be expected to provide a brief budget if you are invited to pitch. Costs might include fees for cast and crew, travel costs, covering personal time, location fees and materials.

The successful applicants will also receive in kind support to the value of £1500, which will contribute towards the production. This includes:

- Hire of [Exeter Phoenix film and sound equipment](#)
- Exeter Phoenix studio hire
- Access to Exeter Phoenix film production facilities
- Support and mentoring from industry experts
- A schedule of industry standard training and workshops provided by Exeter Phoenix.

The finished films will be premiered at [Two Short Nights Film Festival](#) 2023 and advice will be given in festival strategy and developing audiences.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Exeter Phoenix 19-25 Devon Film Fund 2022 is open to:

- Individuals who have a permanent address in **Devon**. Applicants must be able to prove their address.
- Individuals aged between **19-25**. Applicants must be 19 or over when applying. We will accept applications from those who turn 26 during the project timeline.
- The fund is aimed at those who have a passion for making short films or those looking for funding to take their filmmaking to the next level.

The selected filmmaker may be expected to make occasional visits to Exeter, therefore please consider this when applying.

We recognise our work will be stronger with greater diversity and welcome applications by somebody with lived experience of a diverse background.

TIMELINE

- Applications open **Friday 17 December 2021**
- Applications close **5pm, Thu 20 January 2022**
- Decisions made by the week commencing **24 February 2022**
- Successful applicants must be available to pitch their ideas to an audience and panel of experts during TWO SHORT NIGHTS 2022 on Thursday 3 Feb at 4:30pm.
- Training and workshops will take place from spring **2022, dates TBC**
- Projects are to be completed by **December 2022.**

APPLICATION AND ASSESSMENT

Please apply via our [online submission form](#).

You will be asked to submit an original and concise proposal which outlines the tone, themes, genre and strategy of your ideas.

Exeter Phoenix will accept ideas to be presented in written form (up to 400 words) or as a video (up to 3 minutes).

When applying you will have the opportunity to include a link to a show reel and attached supporting material. This could be examples of previous work, stills, writing samples or visual aids.

You will also be asked to complete a [Diversity Standards form](#) when applying. The data submitted when applying and via the diversity standard form will be shared with BFI Film Academy South West / Watershed for reporting purposes.

All applicants will receive a confirmation email to state we have received your application. Applications will be presented to the commission panel after the deadline.

The successful applicant will be notified at Two Short Nights Film Festival on Thursday 3 February after the Live Pitch. All applicants will also be notified of the outcome via email.
