

As a means of tackling isolation and encouraging creativity during the pandemic, we partnered with the Broadway Gallery in Letchworth on Correspondence O1. Twenty artists from the Exeter and Letchworth areas were paired up and offered the opportunity to share ideas and collaborate, before making and exchanging new pieces of work, culminating in physical exhibitions across the two Galleries.

The exhibition was also complemented by the exhibition of a new piece commissioned by our neighbours at the Royal Albert Memorial Museum and displayed in their Courtyard Case.



COMMUNITY COURSES AND WORKSHOPS





DELIVERING 50 CLASSES AND COURSES ATTENDED BY 322 CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE, AND 262 CLASSES AND WORKSHOPS ATTENDED BY 1768 ADULTS

Throughout the year we have delivered a broad range of courses and workshops for people of all ages and abilities. From photography to painting, and drawing to sculpture, there has been plenty to stimulate and support people to try something new and develop their own creative skills.

To complement our existing Young and Animated project, which offers animation and film-making courses for 8-13 year olds, in this year we launched a new project, Young and Animated+ specifically designed for young people with autism.

We have also continued to deliver Freefall and Freefall+, our free weekly art groups for young people and young people with additional needs. During the year the groups have taken part in a range of activities including developing sound-effects to support film-making, building LED light installations and creating cyanotypes from photographs.

Contemporary dance also made a spectacular return to Exeter Phoenix during the year, with powerful performances from Chhaya Collective, Heather Agyepong and Excessive Human Collective.

In line with our endeavours to bring the best of world cinema to local audiences, we also delivered a series of themed programmes to broaden horizons and offer new experiences. One particularly successful initiative saw a rekindling of our engagement with the Japan Foundation to share a season of thoughtfully selected works from Japan's rich artistic repertoire.

Young audiences were brought to the centre of our work in 2021, with the introduction of our Young Audience Panel who helped to feedback on our current activity and inform our future plans and programming to enable us to engage more with this under-represented audience. This project led to an exciting new youth-led rebrand for Studio 74 as well as the introduction of £5 tickets for under 25s

After a hiatus caused by the pandemic, 2022 saw the return of Two Short Nights – our sector-leading short film festival. Over two days novice and established filmmakers were able to share and view a wide range of film work while networking with peers and learning from industry experts. An outstanding success, this year's festival saw 205 submissions received from 27 countries, 60 films shown across seven screenings and welcomed 372 guests.

A HUGE PART OF OUR WORK INVOLVES SUPPORTING ARTISTS AND CREATIVES TO FURTHER THEIR CAREERS AND DEVELOP NEW WORK

Over the course of the year we have supported nearly 900 artists through platforming work, sharing equipment, resources and spaces, offering commissions, running festivals and competitions, holding networking and socials, and providing employment as tutors and course leaders.

Within the year we were able to award a series of artist commissions including our first ever theatre commission, and our artist moving image commission which was awarded to Dan Guthrie and went on to be screened at the Whitstable

In performance, we launched a new series of Scratch Nights. These live events offer performers from a range of disciplines (including theatre, dance, music and spoken word) the opportunity to share their works-in-progress with a full technical complement before a live audience. The events enable performers to trial new ideas and access audience feedback to support and encourage the development of new works.
