

October Scratch Night Commissioned Artists

Throughout 2024 we have offered micro-commissions to support the development and presentation of new performance work for our three annual Scratch Night performances which happened in January and May, with our final Scratch Night of the year happening in October.

Our aim is to identify, support and nurture fresh talent by giving artists the support, space and opportunity to develop work-in-progress pieces. Below we are introducing our successful artists for the October Scratch, and what they will be performing on the evening.



Stewart Wright:
Circus Calamitous

The 'World's Greatest Showman' (his words) Rex Bartholomew brings his internationally-renowned award-winning world-famous circus to the grandest of venues. Except that he doesn't because a clerical error means the circus performers have gone to the wrong address and are 100 miles away. The only people left in the company are Rex himself and his put-upon stagehand Darren...so the two of them will have to put on the show themselves.

The Show Must Go On (especially as Rex is contractually obliged to

provide one). Rex and Darren need to do all the juggling, fire-eating, lion-taming, bullet-catching, the lot. They are also struggling with their own relationship as the long-suffering Darren resents being constantly ordered around by the arrogant Rex.

There's mishaps, squirting water, custard pies, audience participation and a cameo from the only member of the circus troupe that remained on site.....Leslie the Lion. The circus performers never do make it on time but Darren blossoms into a fine circus artist with the encouragement of the children...and he feels he can move on in his relationship with Rex on a more equal footing. The 'World's Greatest Showman' (still his words) Rex Bartholemew learns that it's not a bad thing to be a little humble now and then.

Do You Want To Know?

Kate wants to shake up the world of museum curation. Ben wants to be left alone with his copy of the complete works. When they get the chance to pitch a new exhibition about Shakespeare's life and secure their dream jobs in the process, it seems like they're the perfect duo.

But the internet's been around since Henry VIII; Voltaire's tweets, Newton's Reddit threads and Byron's dick pics are all sitting in an archive. Do you really want to know about Shakespeare? How will Kate and Ben even begin to decide on what to focus on?

For Ben it's easy: the plays – does anything else really matter? But Kate doesn't think it's so simple. When their research into Shakespeare's online presence unearths a shocking revelation, they're forced to confront their own beliefs about separating the art from the artist and how much they're willing to jeopardise in order to reveal (or hide) the truth.

Do You Want to Know? takes in the extinction of secrets in a postinternet age, to ask: what if the greatest literary mystery of our time was not a mystery at all? Is more information always better? And how will we be remembered by future generations?



We're All Friends Comedy:

The Quest for Love, Murder and Revenge in Space

The Quest For Love Murder and Revenge In Space is a fantasy adventure showcasing the epic- oh, wait, no! It's actually a dramatic romance demonstrating the power of- oh, still wrong? That's right, it's a murder mystery in which- Wrong again? A rollicking western, perhaps? A sci-fi saga?

The truth is it's none of them...and all of them! Each night our cast arrive to find that, despite perfectly reasonable instructions from the director, the show hasn't quite been settled on yet. One wants a romance while the other wants sci-fi and, in the end, it's easier to let the audience decide. So, we let you!
